She loved Philadelphia sports, screaming at televised basketball games (especially if Caitlin Clark was playing), happy hours and open bars, all-inclusive vacations, live music, finding a good deal when shopping, spoiling all the kids in her life, and just being with her husband and friends.

She enjoyed life wholeheartedly, and never sweated the small stuff. We all have Jackie stories that'll make us laugh for years to come; she was a character and there's no one else quite like her.
